### CONFLICT OF INTEREST CODE FOR THE

#### VECTOR CONTROL JOINT POWERS AGENCY

The Political Reform Act (Government Code §81000 et. seq.) requires state and local government agencies to adopt and promulgate conflict of interest codes. The Fair Political Practices Commission has adopted a regulation (2 Cal. Code of Regs. Sec. 18730) which contains the terms of a standard conflict of interest code, which can be incorporated by reference in an agency's code. After public notice and hearing it may be amended by the Fair Political Practices Commission to conform to amendments in the Political Reform Act. Therefore, the terms of 2 California Code of Regulations Section 18730 and any amendments to it duly adopted by the Fair Political Practices Commission are hereby incorporated by reference. This regulation and the attached Appendix designating officials and employees and establishing disclosure categories, shall constitute the conflict of interest code for the Vector Control Joint Powers Agency (Agency).

Officials and employees holding positions listed in this code must file their statements of economic interests electronically with the **Fair Political Practices Commission**. All statements must be made available for public inspection and reproduction under Government Code Section 81008.

If any designated position is a business entity, the Statement shall be filed by the individual or individuals in the firm who participate in the making of governmental decisions in conducting the firm's business activities with the **Agency**.

\*Consultants/new positions shall be included in the list of designated positions and shall disclose pursuant to the broadest disclosure category in the code subject to the following limitation:

The Executive Director/Administrator of the **Agency** may determine in writing that a particular consultant or new position, although a "designated position", is hired to perform a range of duties that are limited in scope and thus is not required to comply fully with the disclosure requirements described in this section. Such determination shall include a description of the consultant's duties or new position's duties, and, based upon that description, a statement of the extent of disclosure requirements. The Executive Director's/Administrator's determination is a public record and shall be retained for public inspection in the same manner and location as the Conflict of Interest Code.

## Officials who manage public investments:

The following positions are not covered by the code because the positions manage public investments. Individuals holding such positions must file under Government Code Section 87200 and are listed for informational purposes only. Section 87200 requires disclosure of all investments and business positions in business entities, all income, including gifts, loans and travel payments, and real property.

Members of the Board of Directors Alternate Members of the Board of Directors Executive Director/Administrator Treasurer (if not a Board Member or Alternate) Finance Manager/Assistant Treasurer Consultants that manage public investments

An individual holding one of the above listed positions may contact the Fair Political Practices Commission for assistance or written advice regarding their filing obligations if they believe that their position has been categorized incorrectly. The Fair Political Practices Commission makes the final determination whether a position is covered by Section 87200.

## Disclosure Categories

- 1. Investments and business positions in business entities, and income (including receipt of loans, gifts, and travel payments), from sources of the type that contract with the Agency to supply goods, services, materials, or supplies.
- 2. Investments and business positions in business entities, and income (including receipt of loans, gifts, and travel payments), from sources that are engaged in the performance of work or services of the type utilized by the Agency, including insurance companies, carriers, holding companies, underwriters, brokers, solicitors, agents, adjusters, claims managers, and actuaries.
- 3. Investments and business positions in business entities, and income (including receipt of loans, gifts, and travel payments), from sources that have filed a claim or have a claim pending before the Agency.
- 4. Interests in real property within the Agency's jurisdiction of the type to be leased or purchased by the Agency.
